

## 2015 National Survey of Student Engagement Engagement Indicator Comparisons (Rose-Hulman Senior Students)

The table below compares the weighted average scores of Rose-Hulman senior students to weighted average scores of senior students from Association of Independent Technological Universities (AITU schools)\*, Indiana schools\*\*, All 2014 and 2015 participating institutions, the Top 50% of participating institutions, and the Top 10% of participating institutions. Use the following key to interpret findings from the 2015 National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE):

- ↑↑ RHIT students' average was significantly higher ( $p < .05$ ) with an effect size at least .3 in magnitude.
- ↑ RHIT students' average was significantly higher ( $p < .05$ ) with an effect size less than .3 in magnitude.
- ↔ No significant difference.
- ↓ RHIT students' average was significantly lower ( $p < .05$ ) with an effect size less than .3 in magnitude.
- ↓↓ RHIT students' average was significantly lower ( $p < .05$ ) with an effect size at least .3 in magnitude.
