Call for Abstracts and Abstract Guidelines

The ASEE Illinois-Indiana Region is currently soliciting contributions for the 2025 section conference, hosted at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology in Terre Haute, Indiana on April 12, 2025. We look forward to welcoming participation from as many engineering educators and students as possible by offering a variety of options for contributing content to the conference. Contributions related to any topic in engineering education are welcome. Students are encouraged to attend and may also present on capstone design or technical research content if preferred.

We are offering the following options for presenting content at the conference:

- Workshop If you're interested in offering a 45-minute workshop at the conference, you may submit your idea to the conference organizers for consideration. The deadline for submitting a workshop idea will occur at a later date and does not need to be submitted as a formal abstract. More details to come.
- <u>Paper submission and presentation</u> Works in progress are also welcome to be submitted as papers. Designing your presentation to allow active participation from audience members is encouraged.
- <u>Poster presentation</u> Posters are an option for attendees who would prefer to present their work in poster format. Also consider submitting a poster if: (1) you are a student or student group who plans to present your capstone design work, or (2) you are a student or student group who plans to present a technical research project.
- <u>"Cool thing" presentation</u> No abstract necessary! If you have a unique activity, teaching technique, project, or demonstration you're excited to share (or a unique product you created as a student in a specific class), come prepared to showcase your cool thing. The activity, technique, or demonstration should take no more than 5-10 minutes to complete. Submissions for a "cool thing" presentation will be solicited at a later date.

The deadline for abstract submission is December 13, 2024. Abstracts are required only for paper and poster presentations. All abstracts and papers are double-blind and peer reviewed. Since this conference is expected to be small in scale, we kindly request that each author serves as a reviewer.

When drafting your abstract, please adhere to the following guidelines for preparation and submission:

- Remove identifying author and institute information from the abstract
- Single-spaced document with 10 12-point font for the title and body; any professional typeface is fine.
- Please submit as a PDF.
