Project - Phase 2

Here is the long awaited list of things to do for the project.

• Written Report - Your written report should give an overview of the topic you are presenting. Your audience should be the students in next quarter's ECE 332 class. They should be able to read your report and understand your topic. The written material should be your words and not quotes from your references. You may attach your handouts and refer to them in your report. The length of the body shouldn't be more the six pages, excluding the attachments.

- **References** The quality of the project rests heavily on the quality of your references. In your written report be sure to reference your sources. A project with few references is weaker than a project with a wide range of references. For example if a project uses information only from one Web site, it will receive a lower grade than one getting information from multiple sites, a journal article, and from the manufacture.
- **Oral Report** This is where most of the class will learn about your topic. Don't plan on writing of the board. You don't have time; use handouts instead. You can also use the computer projector for the presentations.
- Handouts Make up as many pages of handouts as you think you need. You may use copies
 of things from your sources, but be sure to give credit. Don't hand out everything, only what
 you need to make your point. I can make copies of your material for the class if you get it to
 me the day before (or earlier) your presentation.
